Way Forward Process

Do something surprisingly out of the ordinary! Perform an uncharacteristic kindness! Suddenly display a hidden gift or talent!... When we do something that is astonishing to others, how often we hear their total surprise as they teasingly exclaim, "Who is this person? What did you do with _____?!" When someone or something, disclosed in a striking way, makes our eyes pop open to it, or stops us in our tracks, we're forced to reconsider our presumptions, judgements, stance, position. The experiences move us to change". In the gospel this weekend, Peter and the disciples are forced to answer Jesus' inquiry, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?"; in essence, "Who is this person?!" that they're following? They're having their eyes propped open to better see who Jesus is! What they see and experience of Jesus forces them to come to new insights and convictions of faith, new stances, new understandings, and new & different ways of living..... And so, in response to Jesus' questioning, Peter finally responds, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." **Eyes Wide Open!!!** What does that mean to you and to me? And, how does our understanding of who Jesus is challenge us to the constant call to change, conversion, and transformation?!!! Consider this reflection on Mt. 19:20-22: *Jesus... asks us to trust him in our discipleship, and through that trust, to move away from what we might hold familiar and comfortable. Familiar and comfortable things are not bad in and of themselves, but Jesus invites us to continually trust in him, and to notice what things we might be holding onto in place of that trust. Maybe it's moving forward in your relationship with someone, saying "yes" to a new job, moving... across the country for school or work or simply carving out time each day for a moment of prayer instead of something else.*

[America: Scripture Reflections, A Reflection for Monday of the Twentieth Week in Ordinary Time, John Console] Moving away from what was, to what God prompts us to become, leads us to the place God needs us to be! For this to happen always requires change with eyes wide open. These days, we are challenged to look at ourselves as Church, Family of Churches, & Parish in a whole new way and to make some major changes. What if our **Way-Forward-Changes** as a Family open wide the eyes of others around us and have them ask of us, "Who is this Church?!" Let's make the changes and take the world around us by surprise! ~ Fr. Bob

First Communion classes begin on October 1 at 6:00 PM at Blessed Trinity. Please advertise however you think will work best for you. Registration is due September 24.

If you bring **Holy Communion** to or visit on behalf of your parish those who are homebound or in nursing homes, you need to be certified in Protecting God's Children. According to the Safe Environment Office, home-bound parishioners are by definition vulnerable adults. If you are not certified, or need to be reinstated, please see Pat Dyer, Paula Hunt, or Lanette Jennings. There will also be a Retreat and Refresher on September 19 at Ss. Columba-Brigid. At that time, we will go over the vulnerable adult piece in more depth.
